Internal Kick-off Meeting Report

Cedre premises, Brest, France

3 and 4 March 2015

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Introduction

As part of Action A1 (Project technical and financial coordination) and Action A2 (Kick-off Meeting (KoM)) of the Project Preparedness for Oil-polluted Shoreline clean-up and Oiled Wildlife interventions 2 (POSOW 2), the technical partners of the project met on the premises of the Centre de documentation, de recherche et d'expérimentations sur les pollutions accidentelles des eaux (Cedre) in Brest, France, for a meeting on 03rd and 04th March 2015.

The proposal 2014/PREP/09 included the participation of a representative of each partner to the KoM meeting which was held in the premises of the European Commission Humanitarian Aid and Civil Protection Directorate-General's (DG ECHO) on 20th January 2015. As DG-ECHO limited the number of participants to two people for each project funded, it was agreed to use the budget planned for this action for the organisation of an internal Kick-off Meeting at Cedre.

The meeting aimed at:

- Following up the statement of Cooperation Agreements and pre-payment to the partners;
- Establishing the project management and publicity procedures and activities; and
- Launching the development of the two new training packages (waste management and role of fishermen) and the translation of the 4 packages developed during POSOW 1 related to volunteer management, oiled shoreline assessment, oiled shoreline clean-up and oiled wildlife response.

Agenda and participants

The meeting started on 3^{rd} March 2015 in the morning and finished on the 4th March 2015 in the afternoon. The agenda is reproduced in **Annex I**. Due to flights schedules, four participants arrived in Brest on the 2^{rd} March and left on the 5^{th} . The last one arrived on the 3^{rd} afternoon and left on the 4^{th} afternoon.

Several representatives of Cedre (coordinator CO) attended parts of the meeting, according to the issues discussed. One representative of each Associated Beneficiary (AB) participated to this meeting:



POSOW Background

Four (4) of the six (6) partners involved in POSOW 2 were involved in POSOW 1: Cedre and ISPRA as Associated Beneficiary, REMPEC as Coordinator and FEPORTS as trainee during train the trainer courses in Cedre and as trainer during the Spanish National Pilot Training course. All of them know very well the main outputs of POSOW 1. POSOW background and outputs were introduced in details to AASTMT and DG-MARINWA who will be in charge of their translation in Arabic and Turkish.

In 2012-2013, the two year POSOW project (hereinafter referred to as POSOW 1) helped to establish regional cooperation synergy in the field of marine pollution through the enhancement of knowledge and




capacities of professional and volunteer operators working in civil protection services, in municipalities and in NGOs, in the European Union coastal Countries of the Mediterranean Sea (namely: Croatia, Cyprus, France, Greece, Italy, Malta, Slovenia and Spain). The four training material packages (volunteer management, oiled shoreline assessment, oiled shoreline clean-up and oiled wildlife response) including manuals, power-point presentations, instructor manuals, posters were presented to DG-MARINWA and AASTMT. The movie, the brochure, the volunteer database, the train the trainer courses held in Cedre in May 2013 and the National Pilot Training courses held in each targeted country, the layman's reports and the POSOW 1 final technical report were also introduced. All these outputs can be downloaded from the POSOW website: www.posow.org

The extension and spreading of the results and benefits of the POSOW 1 project to some targeted Mediterranean European Neighbourhood Countries and EU candidate Countries and potential candidates not participating in the Mechanism (referred to as Mediterranean European Neighbourhood Policy Countries and Enlargement Countries) should improve the oil spill response preparedness of the national civil protection in these countries, their mutual cooperation, as well as facilitate the support of the European Civil Protection Mechanism in case of request for assistance from one or more of these countries.

In this context, the POSOW 2 project aims at expanding the achievements of POSOW 1 (development and provision of Training Material Package, organization of Train the Trainer Courses and National Pilot Training Courses, development and maintenance of POSOW Website and Volunteers Database, etc.) to these targeted non-EU Mediterranean coastal States, namely: Algeria, Egypt, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Tunisia and Turkey.

At the end, 15 countries will benefit from POSOW. The power-point presentations and posters will be available in nine (9) languages (Arabic, Croatian, English, French, Greek, Italian, Slovenian, Spanish and Turkish) and the manuals will be available in three (3) languages (Arabic, English and Turkish).





POSOW 2 - TASK A: Project management and reporting to the DG-ECHO

Project coordination and reporting

POSOW 2 started on the 1st January 2015. The work done in January 2015 was mainly the preparation of the KoM planned in Brussels on the 20th January 2015. A project description and a power-point presentation (**Annex III**) were provided to DG-ECHO and two representatives of Cedre attended the meeting. The bilateral Cooperation Agreement and the internal KoM were prepared in February 2015. The technical implementation of the project started in March with the internal KoM.

The coordinator, Cedre ensures that the schedule of the project is followed; it makes sure that all the actions of each task are fully completed and that the deliverables are properly finalized in due time. Regarding the financial aspects, Cedre ensures the distribution of the EU financial contribution from the Commission to the associated beneficiaries. It checks that the budget is respected. Timesheets will be addressed for every partner to use the same system.

Cedre will maintain regular contacts with the associated beneficiaries (ABs), who endeavour to be available for coordination purpose, and provide the information required by Cedre. Web meetings between all the partners, or only some of them depending on the issue to be tackled, will be organised whenever needed and more often than once every four months as planned in the proposal. During these meetings the partners will review the progress made, share ideas on the contents of the training packages and other deliverables, and plan the work to be done. A short report will be prepared by Cedre, reviewed by partners and sent to our DG-ECHO desk officer.

Cedre will also be in charge of the preparation of the progress and final reports. The associated beneficiaries will provide any technical and financial information needed and will review reports before submission to the Commission. Progress reports on technical and financial implementation will be delivered to the Commission on months 9 and 17. The final report, which will include the final technical report and the final financial statement, will be produced within three (3) months of the end of the project.

Communication procedures and documents sharing

During the project, it will be necessary to exchange a lot of documents and material for review. It will not be possible to use our usual e-mail boxes to exchange such heavy files. Cedre can use a secured cloud hosted by the French Research Institute for Exploitation of the Sea (IFREMER). It is accessible on the following link: https://cloud.ifremer.fr/. This website is secured. A POSOW 2 folder was created by Cedre and shared with all the partners. Each of them has been provided with a login and password. The application was installed and tested on the laptops of the participants to the meeting in Brest. All material prepared by the respective partners will be uploaded on the corresponding folder on the cloud. Each partner shall then review the document and provide its comments to the author of the document.

POSOW 2 - TASK B: Project publicity

Action B1: Website

A specific website was established for POSOW 1 (www.posow.org) and will be updated during the implementation of the POSOW 2 project. The language of the website is English. It will include a presentation of the POSOW 2 project in addition to the information of POSOW 1 (summary, objectives, partners, structure, funding). The "News" section will be maintained, to announce forthcoming training courses and public events, as well as any relevant information. When available, the progress reports will be posted, as well as relevant deliverables. Participants to the Train the Trainer Courses will also find information concerning the logistical aspects of the course as well as relevant technical documents.

The section for registered members (POSOW 2 but also POSOW 1 participants and trainees) will be updated, enabling beneficiaries to access and update the Volunteers Database, the material package, a calendar of the planned activities and to store and exchange relevant material.

The maintenance of the website will be done by REMPEC and all the partners will provide relevant information and material (pictures...). The first up-dating (presentation of POSOW 2, information on KoM, dates of Train the Trainer Courses...) will be done before the end of March 2015.

Action B2: Media

Press release

On the cover page of any material produced, all partners and EC logos shall appear in addition to the short introductory text highlighting the Commission's funding of the project and the Partners contribution. This report adopts the format agreed. Cedre has been provided with the logos of the partners.

Brochure and movie

The available movie and brochure describing the project will be reviewed in order to be disseminated during training courses and other relevant events. They will be downloadable from the project's website.

The review of the brochure and movie in order to include information on POSOW 2 will be done by ISPRA before the end of 2015. ISPRA will liaise with the partners to obtain any video material to be used in the movie. It was agreed that the voice-over narration will not be the same for the part concerning POSOW 2.

Action B3: Project promotion during relevant events

Representatives of the partnership will attend relevant events where they can promote the project and its results, through presentations, submission of an information document or other as relevant. The events will be targeted to ensure the information of decision makers in the field of oil pollution response but also to ensure the interest of the appropriate public for the train the trainer courses and for National Pilot Training courses.

The project promotion will be done by all the partners from now on.



Action B4: Layman's reports

POSOW 1 Layman's report was presented during the KoM.

A Layman's report will also be produced at the end of POSOW 2. It will be prepared by Cedre, reviewed by all the partners and sent to the Commission before 31 March 2017.

POSOW 2 - TASK C: Package material development

Templates and advices to authors



The manuals, power-point presentations and posters templates will be the same as those used for POSOW 1. A document with some advice for their preparation was prepared by Cedre and distributed during the meeting (ANNEX VI).

Each training package is identified by one colour. Two new colours must be defined for waste management and role of fishermen packages.

Cedre will submit to the partners two new colours before the end of March: red, brown or purple.

The common parts of the manuals including cover page, acknowledgment, disclaimer, table of contents, bibliography and glossary were reviewed during the meeting. Including all common pages, the number of page of the manuals shall be minimum 40 pages and maximum 60 pages. The manuals and PowerPoint presentations shall be printable in black and white, in particular forms contained in the manual for prompt photocopy and dissemination.

A first common glossary was developed during POSOW 1 and is available on the cloud. Each partner shall complete it whilst preparing its package.

Diagrams, tables, sketches, etc. shall be provided to Cedre in advance to enable Cedre's designers to prepare them in the adequate format prior to insertion in the final version.

The final version of the training material will be uploaded on POSOW Website upon completion and validation by the Commission.

For photos it was reminded:

- o Photos resolution shall be at least 300dpi;
- o Copyright shall be obtained from the photo/figure source for each illustration;
- o Illustrations shall be referenced and easily identifiable.



Action C1: Development of Waste Management Package

This task is managed by Cedre. A draft table of contents (**ANNEX VII**) has been submitted to all partners during the meeting. When available, all the partners will provide Cedre with relevant information and material on this topic.

The draft manual in English in WORD format will be submitted to the partners for review in June.

The final version of the English version In WORD format will be completed in September 2015 and available for translation.

The final version of the English version in IN-DESIGN format will be prepared in October-November 2015.

The posters will be prepared in English before the end of December 2015.

The instructor manual and Power-Point presentations will be completed in March 2016.

Action C2: Development of Role of Fishermen Package

This task is managed by FEPORTS. A first mission in Galicia where fishermen have the experience of the Prestige oil spill response is planned in March. When available, all the partners will provide FEPORTS with relevant information and material on this topic.

The draft manual in English in WORD format will be submitted to the partners for review in July 2015.

The final version of the English version In WORD format will be completed in October 2015 and available for translation.

The final version in IN-DESIGN format will be prepared in November-December 2015.

The posters will be prepared in English before the end of December 2015.

The instructor manual and power-point presentations will be completed before end of March 2016.

Action C3: Follow-up material

This material will include certificates for trainers and trainees to recognize their involvement in the project and for prompt identification, contacts information sheets for the Volunteers Database, attendance sheets to the training courses. This material shall be available prior to the delivery of the first Train the Trainer session (Task E) and be used as follow-up record keeping system for the continuation of the project. It will support the expansion of a pool of trained volunteers and personnel from municipalities and civil protection established under POSOW 1.

The POSOW 1 Volunteers Database will be maintain by REMPEC to ensure the inclusion of POSOW 2 volunteers and trainers as described in the Action B1 (Website).

As for the website, to ensure continuity of the project and to avoid losing information at the end of the project, the information which will have been uploaded in the restricted area of the project website will be transferred to a specific section of REMPEC website.

Action C4: Updating training material

POSOW 1 teaching material was developed before the train the trainer courses. If needed, feedback remarks and comments from the National Pilot Training courses and from trainers and trainees collected during POSOW 1 will be integrated into a revised version of the training material, together with suggestions from POSOW 2 partners (for instance, adaptation to local features and practices). All the training material developed during POSOW 1 is available on the cloud and on the POSOW website for review.



Action C5: Printing of POSOW 1 and POSOW 2 material

POSOW 1 and POSOW 2 training material must be distributed to the participants of the Train the Trainer courses (posters in Arabic or Turkish and manuals in English) and to the participants of the National Pilot Training courses (manuals in English for English proficient, with Arabic or Turkish versions of the six (6) manuals available on POSOW website). The necessary quantity of the four (4) existing manuals not more available from POSOW 1 project will be re-printed. The two (2) new manuals will be printed. The posters and the new project brochure will also be printed in English, Arabic and Turkish languages.

All the material must be printed and delivered to Cedre before the first Train the Trainer course (Task E) planned in April 2016. Partners will communicate contact details of printing service providers for the call for proposals to be launched by REMPEC in charge of this Action. Printing specifications will be the same as POSOW 1, and the selection with follow the usual REMPEC procedures, with invitations sent to different potential printing companies in different countries as was the case for POSOW 1.

POSOW 2 – TASK D: Training material package translation in Arabic and Turkish

POSOW 1 training material, dealing with four (4) topics, each including slideshows, posters and manuals, and POSOW 2 training material, dealing with two (2) topics, with similar training elements, and publicity material (brochures, newsletters) will be translated from English into Arabic by AASTMT and Turkish by DG-MARINWA.

DG-MARINWA and AASTMT will check whether the software is available in their respective institutes and will make some tests to assess what the most efficient way to prepare translated material is. If possible, they will translate directly from the IN-DESIGN files. If not, they will translate WORD files and design these to be as similar as possible to the printed final English version designed by Cedre. If needed, Cedre will carry out the final designing of the documents before printing or uploading to the website but with strong co-operation with AASTMT and DG-MARINWA since there is no Arabic or Turkish proficient in Cedre.

The translation work will begin in March 2015 with the four (4) existing POSOW 1 training material packages. This will be finished in September 2015 to be followed by the two (2) new POSOW 2 training material packages.

The translation and design of the Arabic and Turkish versions of the posters must be finished before the end of 2015 to be printed and delivered to Cedre in March 2016.

The translation and final design of the rest of the packages which will not be printed (manuals, power-points) shall be completed 1 month before the Train the Trainer courses period.

The translation of material needed for the National Pilot Training courses (programmes, attendance sheet, evaluation sheet, information sheets...) shall be finished before the first session in their respective language (Arabic or Turkish).



POSOW 2 - TASK E: Train the Trainer courses

Two (2) four-day courses will be organised in Cedre facilities and will be attended by participants from the seven (7) targeted beneficiary Countries. Each country will participate through teams composed of individuals trained and experienced in one or several of the following five categories:

- 1) Volunteer management;
- 2) Shoreline assessment/shoreline clean-up;
- 3) Wildlife response;
- 4) Role of fishermen; and
- 5) Waste management.

These individuals will come from relevant NGOs, authorities and organisations.

During the Train the Trainer Courses, participants will be shown how to use the material produced (Task C and Task D) and will be able to subsequently train volunteers, back in their respective countries (Task F).

To foster cooperation between neighbouring regions, it is proposed to organise one (1) course per geographical area, as follows:

- Western area (Algeria, Morocco, Tunisia, half team of Libya linked with western area countries);
- Eastern area (half team of Libya linked with eastern area countries, Egypt, Lebanon, Turkey).

The course will be divided into five (5) modules as follows:

- 1) Volunteer management;
- 2) Oiled shoreline assessment and clean-up;
- 3) Oiled wildlife response;
- 4) Role of fishermen; and
- 5) Waste management.

Training pedagogy will be also taught to trainees. Most of the modules will be composed of theoretical and practical activities. Cedre's outdoor specialized isolated seawater basin where oil can be released and other equipment will be used for the practical activities.

Invitations will be sent by Cedre with the assistance of REMPEC. To ensure that the expected trainers participate in the training courses, the invitation will provide specific profiles for each type of expert targeted. As the Civil Protection is not in charge of shoreline response in some countries, the invitation of the Train the Trainer Course will be to addressed to REMPEC OPRC Focal Points, copy to Civil Protection Focal Points and to the most adequate contact points identified with the help of all partners..

The costs of participation will be covered by the project. Cedre will arrange and pay directly travel and subsistence costs for all attendees.

Participants will be provided with a memory stick with relevant material, and copies of the manuals.

A social event will be taking place on the first day of each training session for team-building purposes.



The dates are the following:

Session 1: 18-22 April 2016 Session 2: 25-29 April 2016

Our DG-ECHO Desk Officers will be invited to attend the said courses.

Cedre will propose a draft programme to the partners.

POSOW 2 - TASK F: National Pilot Training Courses

The National Pilot Training Courses will be organized by the team of trainers who participated in the Train the Trainer courses, in their respective countries, with the assistance of one of the project partners. The persons organising the course will invite 30 targeted trainees to participate in a three-day National Pilot Training Course, to which the trainers trained in task E will contribute. Volunteers but also personnel from municipalities or civil protection will be trained to support shoreline assessment, shoreline and coastal at sea clean-up, oiled wildlife response operations, waste management and response at sea with fishermen support.

To ensure the quality of the course, one (1) representative of the project partners will be attending each course. The distribution of the courses between the partners is the following:

- FEPORTS in Algeria and Morocco;
- ISPRA in Tunisia and Libya;
- REMPEC in Egypt and Turkey;
- Cedre in Lebanon

Participants will be asked to fill in an evaluation sheet that will be available in their language (translation made by AASTMT and DG-MARINWA). For each course, the partner attending the course will be providing a report.

To ensure the collaboration of the national competent authorities for the organisation of the course, they will be contacted well in advance by the Partners of the project who will participate to the national training courses, assisted by Cedre. The national authorities will be involved to target the appropriate participants and guarantee their interest and relevance for the training.



ANNEX VI: Advices to author

MANUALS

Context

You are in charge of drafting an operational manual as part of the collection of manuals produced through the POSOW project. Please find below a list of advice.

Drafting the content in Microsoft Word or Open Office

- Divide the content into two parts:
 - Generalities for trainers
 - o Technical datasheets for volunteers (i.e. not spill response specialists)

with in addition:

- a table of contents
- a glossary
- o a bibliography.
- Organise the content into <u>short sections</u>.
- Be <u>concise</u> and prefer <u>short sentences</u>: do not overfill pages and avoid being too wordy: in order for a manual to be operational, the essential information must be quickly and easily understood.
- Provide concrete examples and anecdotes from the field.
- Remember to record the bibliographical references used as you go along.
- Record and define the words that should be included in the glossary as you go along.
- Be consistent in the use of <u>tense</u>: general content is written in the present tense, examples of past incidents are described in the past tense.
- Words per page:
 - light content: 200 words (leaves room for 2-3 illustrations or one large picture on the page)
 - o dense content: 450 words (leaves room for 1 medium-sized illustration)
- No foot notes
- As you write, keep a note of the key messages that should be used in the <u>PowerPoint</u> <u>presentations</u> and <u>posters</u>.
- Photos: a large photo is sometimes more useful than several thumbnails.

- 40 pages minimum, do not exceed <u>60 pages</u> per manual, including the cover, contents, glossary and bibliography.
- Bibliography: use APA standards (see manual template prepared by Cedre).

The content delivered to *Cedre* for formatting is the <u>definitive content</u>. Any changes made thereafter should only relate to the manual's presentation.







Dense text: 430 words Light text: 230 word

Technical datasheet: 240 words

Illustrations

Photos:

- Select the relevant photos (beware of details that are not consistent with the rules laid down in the manual, e.g. no PPE...)
- o Ensure that usage rights have been granted.
- o Record the source/copyright to be featured on each photo used.
- Provide separate image files (e.g. JPG format) in high definition (300 dpi) Do not insert them in the Word document.
- Give each photo a caption (including the date, location and description)

Diagrams:

- Ensure that usage rights have been granted when using existing diagrams.
- For new diagrams: provide a sketch, photos, explanatory text or any other elements that will help to define the diagram required.

Acknowledgements

Make sure you remember to thank the main external contributors in the first pages or within the document itself.

Record the postal address of external contributors in order to thank them once the manual has been published.

Drafting the content in Microsoft Power-Point

The drafting phase is made under Power Point. To do so, Cedre provides you with a PowerPoint file in real size (120 cm x 80 cm) whether in portrait or landscape format to help you visualize the result during the phase of conception.

The final editing of the posters will be done by Cedre by using the model common to 6 themes.

Photos

- Provide all the photos in high definition (300 DPI)
- Make sure that we are authorized to reuse these images (copyrights)

Text

Be clear in the messages: short titles – short sentences. Maximum number of words: 200

Illustrations

- In case of graph, sketch to be integrated, think of transmitting files sources (ai, eps) in high resolution. For the graphs, we will need the excel table.
- If required, provide all the technical elements for the execution of drawings (scanned sketches, sketch under Word or Power Point)...
